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## 1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1. To provide members of the Police and Crime Panel a draft of the Policing and Crime 2021/22 Annual Report for comment and feedback before formal publication in the autumn.

## 2. INFORMATION

- 2.1. The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 states that policing bodies (in this case the Mayor) must produce an Annual Report that sets out the exercise of the body's functions in each financial year.
- 2.2. This annual report covers the financial year 2021/22, and describes key activity undertaken by the Mayor and Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime (DMPC) during this period, and demonstrates key activity undertaken by the Mayor and DMPC, the police and partners, towards meeting the outcomes and priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan 21-24.
- 2.3. This is a draft of the report; we will publish a full style version in due course. In the meantime, there is an opportunity for the Police and Crime Panel and other partners to comment on the content.
- 2.4. This report reflects feedback from the Panel in previous years, and includes greater detail on use of the Community Safety Fund and investments made by West Yorkshire Police.

3.1.
